

Preliminary Market Research – Questionnaire for providers of scientific, regulatory, and technical support related to ECHA's risk management activities

Introduction

The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) is conducting a market consultation to gain an understanding of the interest and availability in participating in a call for tenders for a framework contract to support ECHA's work on managing the risks of chemicals. To this end, ECHA invites you to take the guestionnaire below.

This document starts with general information on the questionnaire followed by more specific background information and the actual questions. The feedback collected through the questionnaire will help ECHA in effectively organising the call for tenders – your input is therefore valuable and appreciated.

Important: Before answering the questions, please read through carefully the background information provided below.

1. General Information

- The information included in this questionnaire is only indicative; it is meant to give context to the respondents so that they can provide informed answers, but does not commit or bind ECHA, i.e. with regard to any procurement launched in the future.
- The responses do not bind the respondents in any way either. Specifically, the
 information to be collected through this questionnaire will not be considered by ECHA
 in the evaluation of any request to participate or tender submitted during an eventual
 procurement procedure launched by the Agency.
- The identity of organisations that respond to this questionnaire will not be disclosed to any third party except the European Court of Auditors, the European Anti-Fraud Office or, for the processing of personal data, the European Data Protection Supervisor, if requested for the performance of audits and checks.
- The responses to be provided in the free text fields of this questionnaire should be clear and standalone, i.e. without web links to documents or websites.
- No further interviews are planned to take place with the respondents. Therefore, we kindly invite you to provide as many information as you feel is relevant for ECHA to best assess the market situation.

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2. Background Information

ECHA is considering opening a call for tenders for a new framework contract to support its risk management activities under REACH, the EU Battery Regulation, Industrial Emissions Directive, OECD Projects (e.g. SWACHE)¹, and other potential new ECHA tasks².

The purpose of the new framework contract(s) is to provide ECHA with scientific, regulatory, and technical support related to the regulation of hazardous substances. This includes support with tasks, such as collecting and analysing information; preparing reports and documents; conducting surveys to collect information; and developing methodologies for socio-economic analysis, among other things. More specifically, tasks that contractors would support ECHA with include collecting and analysing information on:

Risk assessment:

- Human exposure and the hazards of the relevant substances related to their impact on human health and/or the environment, including the derivation of dose-response curves and scientific limit values;
- Emissions/releases to the environment, including carbon footprints; the retrieval of information on end-of life of substances and articles including life cycle assessment.
- Hazards, risks, and the environmental footprint of producing substances, including technical and economic feasibility, availability and market acceptance of potential alternatives to harmful substances.

Socio-economic analysis:

- Socio-economic impacts of regulatory measures, including the quantification and monetisation of effects, the conduct and analysis of market surveys etc.
- Potential alternatives to relevant substances, including available information on the alternatives' economic feasibility, and availability.

• Economic analysis:

 Empirical and theoretical methodologies related to socio-economic analysis, including elements of environmental, health and public economics.

The framework contract may be divided into lots that are separately contracted out based on the subject area and/or the type of task.³ Interested economic operators are invited to analyse the three above-mentioned areas and consider the opportunity to submit joint offers and/or include subcontractors to cover the full depth of work to be done under the framework contract(s).

The purpose of the call for tenders is to ensure that ECHA makes the best use of the products and services available on the market. In connection with that, the aim of this market survey is to:

- 1. Validate the availability of offerings on the market;
- 2. Ensure that a potential call for tender is sufficiently attractive to market participants; and
- 3. Help ECHA with identifying the types of offerings that could cover ECHA's needs.
