

Appointment of Committee members

65th Meeting of the Management Board 29-30 March 2022

Proposal

- The Management Board is invited to appoint one new candidate for the Committee for Risk Assessment (RAC).
- The Management Board is invited to appoint four new candidates for the Committee for Socio-economic Analysis (SEAC).

Background

Each Member State may nominate candidates to membership of RAC and SEAC. The Executive Director is required to establish a list of nominees, which is published on the ECHA website. The Management Board shall appoint the members of the Committee from this list, including at least one member but no more than two from the nominees of each Member State. Members shall be appointed for their experience in performing the tasks specified in the REACH Regulation. Further, the membership of Committee members appointed for a term of three years shall be renewable. In order to safeguard the independence, integrity and credibility of the Committees, Member States were asked to make their nominations in accordance with the eligibility criteria as updated in February 2019.

A letter dated 20 October 2021 was sent by the Secretariat to those Member State Permanent Representations which are due to (re-)nominate candidates for membership of RAC and SEAC. The nominations attached were submitted in 2022.

Member States were asked for written commitment to provide adequate scientific and technical resources to the nominated member and to enable them to use at least half of their working time for this task. Commitment to provide such support has been received from the Member States for all the nominees (see Annex 2-6).

In addition to the review of their CV and other nomination information by the Committee Chairs, the new nominees are interviewed to make sure that they understand the level of commitment in terms of time and contribution to the Committees and confirm that they are available.

Rationale

New candidates for RAC membership

There is one new nomination for the Committee for Risk Assessment (RAC).

MS	Nominated RAC member	Feedback from the RAC Chair
LT	STRUMYLAITĖ Loreta	Dr Strumylaitė is currently employed as a Senior Researcher at the Lithuanian University of Health Sciences' Neuroscience Institute Laboratory of Toxicology. She has an in-depth knowledge of Biomonitoring, Epidemiology and Occupational hygiene. Dr Strumylaitė was interviewed by the RAC Chair on 2 February where she confirmed her interest in working on OELs. Her expertise is also useful for the epidemiological parts of CLH dossiers.



She confirmed the support of her management to her
working commitment to RAC. Dr Strumylaite's
declaration of interest does not raise any issues of
concern, making her eligible for membership of the
Committee.

New candidates for SEAC membership

There are four new nominations for the Committee for Socio-economic Analysis (SEAC).

MS	Nominated SEAC members	Feedback from the SEAC Chair
GR	SOFIKITI Nikoletta	Dr Sofikiti is currently employed as a Chemist at the section of chemical products at the Independent Authority for Public Revenue (IAPR), General Chemical State Laboratory (GCSL), Directorate of Energy, Industrial and Chemicals Products. She holds a PhD in Chemistry, and has had experience in academia, industry and the public sector (including with the implementation of REACH). The combined expertise gained through her work will be valuable in SEAC's assessment of analysis of alternatives.
		Dr Sofikiti was interviewed by the Chair on 17 February 2022. She confirmed being able to commit 50 % of her work time to the Committee, and her declaration of interest does not raise any issues of concern.
ES	GRACIA FERNÁNDEZ Ignacio	Dr Gracia Fernández is currently employed as a Professor of Chemical Engineering at the University of Castilla La Mancha. He holds a PhD in Chemical Engineering, as well as a Master's Degree in Business. His broad expertise, which covers both the area of economic and technical evaluation of chemical processes, as well as several relevant areas of socio-economic analysis, make him very well-suited for membership in SEAC.
		Dr Gracia Fernández was interviewed by the Chair on 20 January 2022. He confirmed being able to commit 50 % of her work time to the Committee, and his declaration of interest does not raise any issues of concern.
IT	REALE Priscilla	Dr Reale is currently employed as a Researcher at ENEA - the National Agency for New Technologies, Energy and Sustainable Economic Development, Department of Fusion and Nuclear Safety, starting from 2012. She holds a PhD in Material Science and has had long experience with REACH (including working on the National REACH HelpDesk). Her expertise will be useful for SEAC's work on analysis of alternatives. Additionally, since 2016 Dr Reale has acted as advisor to the Italian SEAC member she has been nominated to replace. The previous member was a specialist in socio-economic analysis, so through that work, in addition to familiarity with the work of SEAC in general, Dr Reale has also acquired good familiarity with socio-economic analysis.



		Dr Reale was interviewed by the Chair on 1 March 2022. She confirmed being able to commit 50 % of her work time to the Committee, and her declaration of interest does not raise any issues of concern.
LU	FREUDENTHAL Oona	Dr Freudenthal is currently employed in the Luxembourg Institute of Science and Technology as a R&T Associate and before that during 2018-2020 as a Regulatory Science Engineer. She holds a PhD in biophysical chemistry, and has significant experience working with REACH (including as member of the ECHA HelpNet) and specifically Substances of Very High Concern (SVHCs), in addition to experience in academia. Her expertise will be useful for SEAC's work on analysis of alternatives. Dr Freudenthal was interviewed by the Chair on 9 February 2022. She confirmed being able to commit 50 % of her work time to the Committee, and her declaration of interest does not raise any issues of
		concern.

Alternative options

The Management Board could decide not to appoint a second member nominated by a given Member State. This would be contradictory to the requests made for nominating a second member and detrimental to the efforts to strengthen the capacity of the Committees for coping with their high workload, in particular where the member has demonstrated to be an active one. No other candidates have been proposed and there are therefore no alternative candidates to appoint. The Secretariat will continue to monitor the activity level of the appointed members to inform their potential renewal.

Drawbacks

The only visible disadvantage of the proposal lies in the costs related to reimbursement of members. The benefits of the additional expertise outweigh these costs by far.
