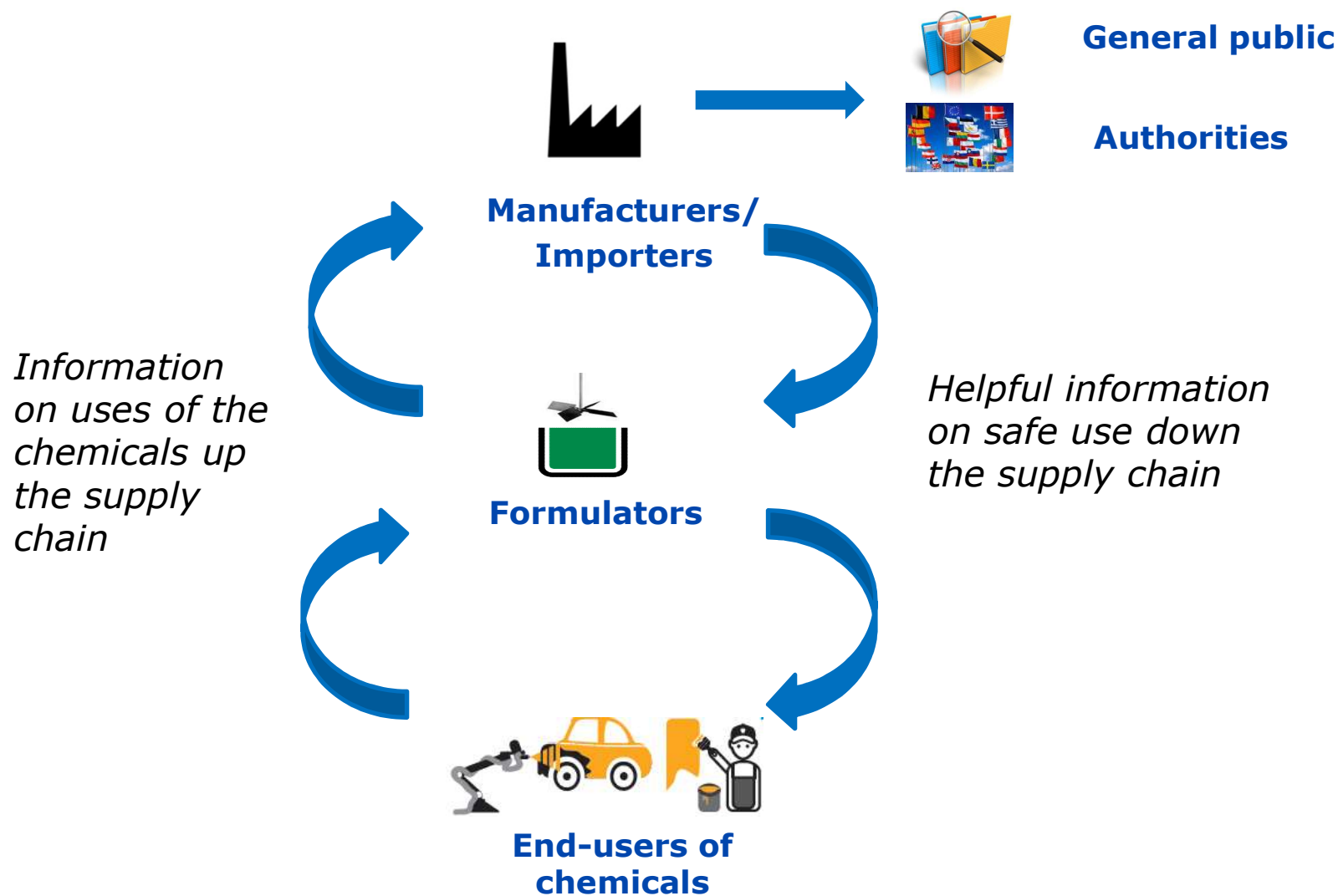

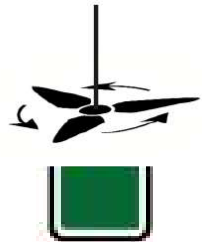
DU sector organisations:

Registrants:

- Select relevant use maps
- Generate exposure scenarios for assessment based on use maps



Formulators and DU users:

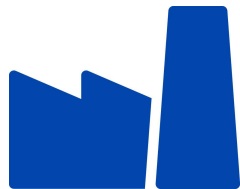
- Check uses are covered by ES provided
- Implement conditions described in the ES received

The main players and key actions



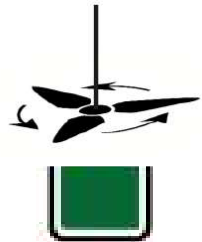
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- ENES9: request for ECHA to explore the possibility to host the available use maps in order to provide a **central repository** for registrants
- March-April 2016: ECHA carried out a survey among sectors on key features of such hosting solution
- May 2016: Hosting solution further discussed in a workshop in Brussels
- June-July 2016: ECHA prepared a proposal including some mock-ups of how the platform would look like and circulated it to the CSR/ES Roadmap-ENES Coordination Group for comments.
- September 2016: Consensus
- October 2016: First use map in the library

The table below gives an overview of the sectors that have submitted information in the library.

To support registrants in selecting relevant use maps an indication of the type of substances and of the type of products covered by each sector is provided.

Clicking on a sector opens a new page where further information can be found and files can be downloaded. As a first step, registrants are invited to open the use map (if available) and check in the 'other documents' section whether the sector has published some specific guidance for its use map.

Sectors can request for their information to be updated. The content and the date of the latest updates are displayed in each sector section. Details on what has been updated are described in the history table at the beginning of each file.

This library is filled in with information submitted by the sectors. During the interim period until the library is filled the overview table of the sector association activities published by CEFIC can help to find out the availability of previous use maps information (table last updated: January 2016). You can find the link to this table in the related links box.

- Possibility to include the files in CHESAR format: direct import in assessment tool - no manual retyping!
- Includes possibility for additional documents (guidance, review report, ...)
- Note: No plan to host SUMIs

Submission to the library

- Sectors submit their use maps element(s) to ECHA for inclusion in the library
 - Webform available in the 'Templates and submission' tab on ECHA Use maps web page
- Limited, fit-for-purpose check by ECHA:
 - Not a formal process; rather a dialogue with sectors!
 - ✓ Proper application of the concepts
 - ✓ Unclarities
 - ✓ General consistency
 - ✓ Further improvement needs
- Sectors free to decide what to do with ECHA's feedback
- Publication

Observations from first submissions – Use maps

- Focus is currently on use maps and SWEDs. Update/development of SPERCs/SCEDs and CHESAR files as a second step
- Name of use/contributing activities: in some cases not explicit/ intuitive. Are more details needed for registrants/DUs?
- Missing references to standard phrases. Need for new phrases? Need for improved metadata in existing catalogue?
- Information provided outside the structured fields: need to think carefully who the information is intended for (not all fields end up in CSR or ES for communication)
- Relevance and description of the article service-life unclear or missing

Observations from first submissions – SWEDs

- Inputs inconsistent with the TRA workers or incomplete
 - -> registrants cannot use the SWED as such, they will have to make some choices if they want to run the TRA
 - To which extent can registrants adapt SWEDs input?
- Closed system or full automation claimed (e.g. via CA name or PROCs) but not reflected into conditions of use.
 - -> A set of standard texts/phrases may be needed to describe conditions most typical for the sector. The receiving downstream user should be able to understand whether his actual conditions can be regarded as e.g. "closed".

 More guidance

Observations from first submissions – SWEDs

- Reflecting same CAs under different levels of control: "*High / Medium / Low RMM*" in CA name. Could it be used systematically? Does this require harmonisation across sectors?
- SWEDs used as input to other tools than TRA. Current template may be complemented to better support that.
 - Expanding some picklists for some conditions of use (e.g. ventilation, RPE in ART, Stoffenmanager)
 - Proposing new "standardised" conditions of use for some tools

Next steps

- More sectors to develop and publish use maps
 - Discuss in your supply chains who is the best placed
- Registrants to start using available use maps for their assessment
 - Provide feedback to the sectors/share learnings
