

Os 3.1 Joint initiative ECHA Forum – ECHA ASOs on Improvement of the quality of SDSs

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Objectives

- Identify the common deficiencies found in the SDSs and propose solutions for improvement and encourage ECHA ASOs to implement the solutions and monitoring the progress.
- To increase the quality of the SDS by the means of pro-active measures taken by industrial stakeholder organisations both at a European and national level.

5.1.1 WG progress report





WG Progress since last open session

- The WG completed the analysis of the main deficiencies found with SDS
- The "Report on Improvement of Quality of SDS" was adopted and published by the Forum <u>https://echa.europa.eu/documents/10162/2274</u> 9747/echa_sds_report_en.pdf/0ddb021f-bd1a-09e6-29f3-c52ca476e6aa
- The WG had 2 joint meetings to discuss the content of the report and the way forward

5.1.2 Short presentation of the 'Improvement of quality of SDS' report



Main issues

- no reporting on uses advised against, unclear identified uses and an absence of a required emergency telephone number in Section 1
- incorrect classification in SDS Section 2 and in correlation with this issue, incorrect reporting of concentration ranges of ingredients in mixtures in Section 3
- non provision of national occupational exposure limits and an inadequacy of information provided on control measures, including engineering controls and specific details on personal protective equipment (PPE) in Section 8
- lack of information on the physical/chemical, toxicological and eco-toxicological properties in Sections 9, 11 and 12, with no explanation as to the reason for the absence of the information as required to be stated.



The issues are mainly related to:

- 1. It not being clear what is expected for certain Sections: 1, 3, 7 and 8
- 2. Missing information in Sections 1, 2, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 15
- 3. Information not specific enough, or too generic to be helpful in Sections 7, 8, 11 and 12
- Consistency between Sections: such as 2 (classification) and 3 (mixture composition), and even subsections 8.1.1 (national OELs) and 8.1.3 (monitoring)
- 5. Inconsistent or missing information related to ingredient(s) classification in Sections 3, 11 and 12

Recommendations



Overall companies should check and feedback the following:

- That all sections that are required to be completed. When the information is not relevant or available, the reason for this should be indicated as required by the legal text.
- That the safety data sheets are up-to-date with the current chemical legislation i.e. development of harmonised classification
- That there is consistency between the different sections of the safety data sheet



This could be achieved by

- developing guidance to clarify what is expected,
- supporting the development of IT-tools in discussion with service providers,
- publishing good examples,
- raising awareness through promotion campaigns etc.
