DECISION ON A COMPLIANCE CHECK OF A REGISTRATION PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 41(3) OF REGULATION (EC) NO 1907/2006

The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) has taken the following decision in accordance with

he procedure set out in Articles 50 and 51 of Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 concerning the Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH Regulation).
I. <u>Procedure</u>
Pursuant to Article 41(1) of the REACH Regulation ECHA has performed a compliance check of the registration for 2-ethylhexyl lactate, CAS No 6283-86-9 (EC No 228-503-2), submitted by (Registrant). The scope of this compliance check is limited to the standard information requirement of Annex VII, Section 7.5. of the REACH Regulation. ECHA stresses that it has not checked the information provided by the Registrant and other coint registrants for compliance with requirements regarding the identification of the substance (Section 2 of Annex VI).
This decision is based on the registration as submitted with submission number for the tonnage band of 1 to 10 tonnes per year. This decision does not take into account any updates submitted after 30 October 2014, the date upon which ECHA notified its draft decision to the Competent Authorities of the Member States pursuant to Article 51(1) of the REACH Regulation.
This compliance check decision does not prevent ECHA from initiating further compliance checks on the present registration at a later stage.
The compliance check was initiated on 19 November 2013.
On 10 July 2014 ECHA sent the draft decision to the Registrant and invited him to provide comments within 30 days of the receipt of the draft decision.
By 18 August 2014 the Registrant did not provide any comments on the draft decision to ECHA.
On 30 October 2014 ECHA notified the Competent Authorities of the Member States of its draft decision and invited them pursuant to Article 51(1) of the REACH Regulation to submit proposals for amendment of the draft decision within 30 days of the receipt of the notification.

As no proposal for amendment was submitted, ECHA took the decision pursuant to Article



II. Information required

Pursuant to Articles 41(1), 41(3), 10(a)(vii), 12(1)(a), 13 and Annex VII of the REACH Regulation the Registrant shall submit the following information using the indicated test methods and the registered substance subject to the present decision:

Vapour pressure (Annex VII, 7.5.; test method: EU A.4./OECD 104).

Note for consideration by the Registrant:

The Registrant may adapt the testing requested above according to the specific rules outlined in Annexes VI to X and/or according to the general rules contained in Annex XI of the REACH Regulation. In order to ensure compliance with the respective information requirement, any such adaptation will need to have a scientific justification, referring to and conforming with the appropriate rules in the respective Annex, and an adequate and reliable documentation.

Failure to comply with the request(s) in this decision, or to fulfil otherwise the information requirement(s) with a valid and documented adaptation, will result in a notification to the Enforcement Authorities of the Member States.

Pursuant to Article 41(4) of the REACH Regulation the Registrant shall submit the information in the form of an updated registration to ECHA by exact date **10 December 2015**.

III. Statement of reasons

Pursuant to Article 41(3) of the REACH Regulation, ECHA may require the Registrant to submit any information needed to bring the registration into compliance with the relevant information requirements.

In accordance with Articles 10(a)(vii) and 12(1) of the REACH Regulation, any registration for a substance manufactured or imported in quantities of 1 tonne or more per year per manufacturer/importer shall contain this information on the vapour pressure. This is a standard information requirement as laid down in Annex VII, Section 7.5. of the REACH Regulation.

The technical dossier contains a single study record for the requirement "vapour pressure". It reports data that, according to the information provided by the Registrant, meet Klimisch criterion 4 only, so it is considered not to be reliable. The Klimisch criterion is a system to assess the reliability of data as laid out in the Guidance on information requirements and chemical safety assessment Chapter R.4: Evaluation of available information, Section R.4.2 (Version of December 2011). As the Registrant has not provided any reliable data and the standard information requirement of Annex VII, Section 7.5. of the REACH Regulation has not been fulfilled.

In conclusion, the registration dossier is non compliant with the information requirement of vapour pressure.

Therefore, the Registrant is requested to carry out a study on the vapour pressure using the appropriate test method and the registered substance and to submit the resulting information.



IV. Adequate identification of the composition of the tested material

ECHA stresses that the information submitted for identifying the substance has not been checked for compliance with the substance identity requirements set out in Section 2 of Annex VI of the REACH Regulation. The Registrant is reminded of his responsibility to ensure that his registration covers one substance only and that the substance is correctly identified in accordance with Annex VI, Section 2 of the REACH Regulation. In carrying out the study required by the present decision it is important to ensure that the particular sample of substance tested is appropriate to assess the properties of the registered substance, taking into account any variation in the composition of the technical grade of the substance as actually manufactured. If the registration of the substance covers different grades, the sample used for the new study must be suitable to assess these.

Furthermore, there must be adequate information on substance identity for the sample tested and the grade(s) registered to enable the relevance of the study to be assessed.

V. Information on right to appeal

An appeal may be brought against this decision to the Board of Appeal of ECHA under Article 51(8) of the REACH Regulation. Such an appeal shall be lodged within three months of receiving notification of this decision.
